

Expressions of Interest – Regional Advisory Groups

Citrus New Zealand is establishing Regional Advisory Groups (RAG's) to strengthen industry collaboration and ensure grower perspectives are well represented in decision-making. These groups will provide strategic and operational advice to the CNZ board on matters affecting the citrus industry, helping to address regional challenges and opportunities.

What is a RAG?

Each RAG will serve as a platform for growers, packers, and industry stakeholders to contribute insights, share concerns, and influence industry strategies. Three groups will operate across Kerikeri, Bay of Plenty, and Gisborne, ensuring a regional focus on citrus industry priorities.

Key Objectives:

- Provide input on regional challenges and opportunities
- Act as a liaison between CNZ and local stakeholders
- Support industry-wide initiatives and collaboration
- Ensure regional perspectives inform sector decision-making

Who Can Be Involved?

Each RAG will have up to four members, including:

- Regional citrus growers
- Packers and marketers
- Representatives from related industry sectors

How Will RAGs Operate?

- Meetings: Twice a year, either in person or online with meetings in May and August
- Leadership: Chaired by a CNZ board grower representative
- Agenda & Outcomes: Meetings will be structured with agendas shared in advance, and key insights will help shape discussions at regional SHEDTalk meetings



Selection Process

All EOI's will be reviewed by the CNZ board grower representative for each region, in consultation with the CNZ board. Selection will be based on:

- Industry experience and involvement in the citrus sector
- Ability to contribute valuable insights on regional challenges and opportunities
- Ensuring a balanced mix of perspectives within each RAG.

Applicants will be notified of the outcome once all EOI's have been reviewed.
